

## **Presentation of Project 2**

### Structural Dynamics VSMN10

The presentation of project 2 consists of three parts: written report, oral presentation and assessment of another groups' report and presentation.

#### **Report:**

Should be submitted electronically to Per-Erik Austrell [pea@byggmek.lth.se](mailto:pea@byggmek.lth.se) at the latest **12.00 Thursday** according to the course program. Then the reports will be sent out for reading and assessment to those groups that will give presentations on the same occasion. Note that only one .pdf-file should be sent for each group. Name the report file as; *Project 2\_group n.pdf*

#### **Questions to consider on reading and assessing reports:**

Are there differences in the way to describe the problem? Are there differences in the way of solving the problem? Do the solutions differ in any way? Is the description detailed enough? Is the description too extensive, could things be removed without understanding is lost?

Concerning the form and appearance, for example, is it easy to follow the text? What quality are the figures? Is there a summary? Etc.

These comments shall be addressed in an assessment of the reports you have been given out. You should conclude this discussion by ranking reports and give reasons for this ranking. This is done in the form of a memorandum of maximum two pages sent to [pea@byggmek.lth.se](mailto:pea@byggmek.lth.se) at the latest on **Friday 12:00** according to the course program.

The heading of the PM should be; *Group n assessing group k and m* and name the file as: *PM\_Proj.2\_group n.pdf*

#### **Oral presentation:**

Date and time: Tuesday and Wednesday at 9-12 and 13-15 both days according to the course program. See schedule on the web page for each group. Location: see course program.

#### **The presentation:**

Two (or three) groups will present their work on the same occasion. Each group has a maximum of 10-15 minutes for presentation followed by a maximum 15-minute opposition and discussion. Each group will be presenting parts (about 1/2) of the report. The presentation should provide an accessible description of the group's findings, conditions and limitations, difficulties, etc. Who is doing what is determined at the start of the presentation session. This means that "everyone must be prepared for everything".

#### **Opposition:**

Each group presents from their PM (according to the above) what you think about the other groups' report and also what you think about the oral presentation in relation to their own work.
